

Mississippi Public Education Underfunding

The columns below show the amount that students in each school district have their education underfunded for a single year based on each of three standards: 1) the adequacy standard for Mississippi as defined in state law; 2) the level at which our neighboring southern states fund their schools; and 3) how schools across the nation, on average, provide funding for their children's public education. Mississippi falls woefully short by any of these measures. Our children deserve better.
